Barbara R. Brown's sculptures continue to dazzle Sedona art admirers

Barbara R. Brown is a local Sedona Sculptor. She has been creating Bronze Angels, Frogs, Dragons and Javelina for fourteen years for galleries from Sedona to Scottsdale and her work is collected worldwide. Although her work varies, Barbara is admittedly quite partial to Javelina and she sculpted her first life-size family of Bronze Javelina in 1995.

Barbara has been a participant in the Sedona Sculpture Walk since 1993. She was recently asked by Wilma Wilcox to design a bench to be placed on Jordan Road as part of the Jordan Sidewalk Pioneer Pathway project. She is co-creating this architectural sculpture in collaboration with Excalibur's Tom and Lori Lever. The bench will be about seven feet long and will have three dimensional, life-size metal Javelina at each end.

The Rotary Club of Sedona Red Rocks used the mother and baby javelina from her Bronze Edition to commemorate their fourth anniversary and it is installed in Uptown Sedona. Barbara also created the original sculpture used for Sedona's "Javelinas on Parade," a joint project of the Sedona Art Festival and Chamber of Commerce.

Focusing on an entirely new medium, Barbara has begun creating Fine Art in Concrete. The first in this collection is a trio of life-size baby javelina known as PatioPigs. The newest addition is a 16 inch Raven cast in black concrete, which is the first in a line of PatioPets. Patio Frogs, Dragons and more will soon follow. They are sold locally.
